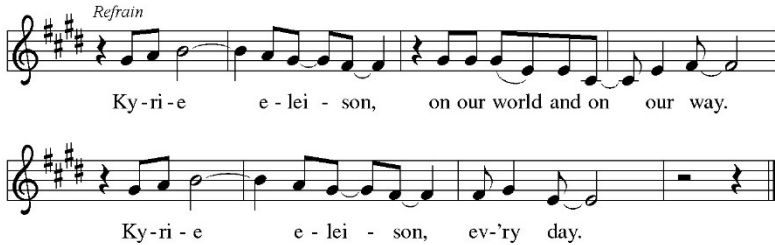

WORD

FIRST READING: Romans 3:19-28

¹⁹ Now we know that, whatever Torah says, it speaks to those who are under Torah, so that every mouth may be silenced and the whole world may be held accountable to God.

²⁰ For no human will be justified before God by deeds prescribed by Torah, for through Torah comes the knowledge of sin.

²¹ But now, apart from Torah, the righteousness of God has been disclosed and is attested by the Law and the Prophets, ²² the righteousness of God through the faithfulness of Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, ²³ since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; ²⁴ they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵ whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. God did this to demonstrate his righteousness, because in God's divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; ²⁶ it was to demonstrate at the present time God's own righteousness, so that he is righteous and he justifies the one who has the faithfulness of Jesus.

²⁷ Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. Through what kind of law? That of works? No, rather through the law of faith. ²⁸ For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.

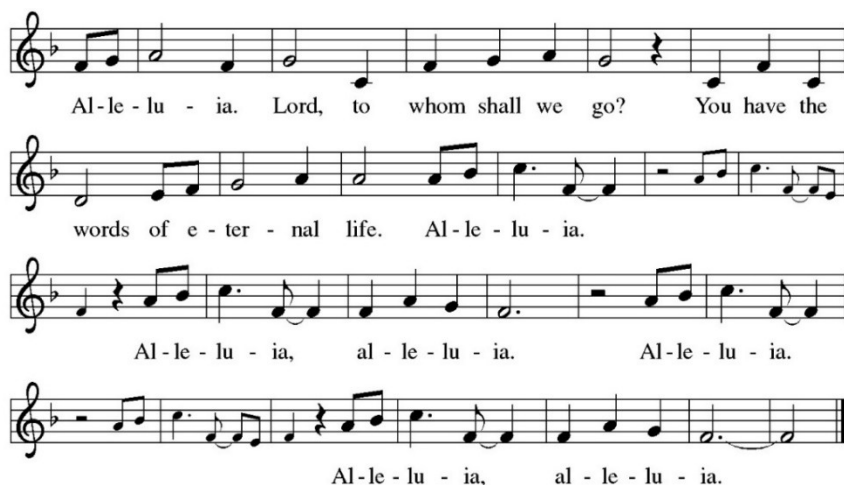

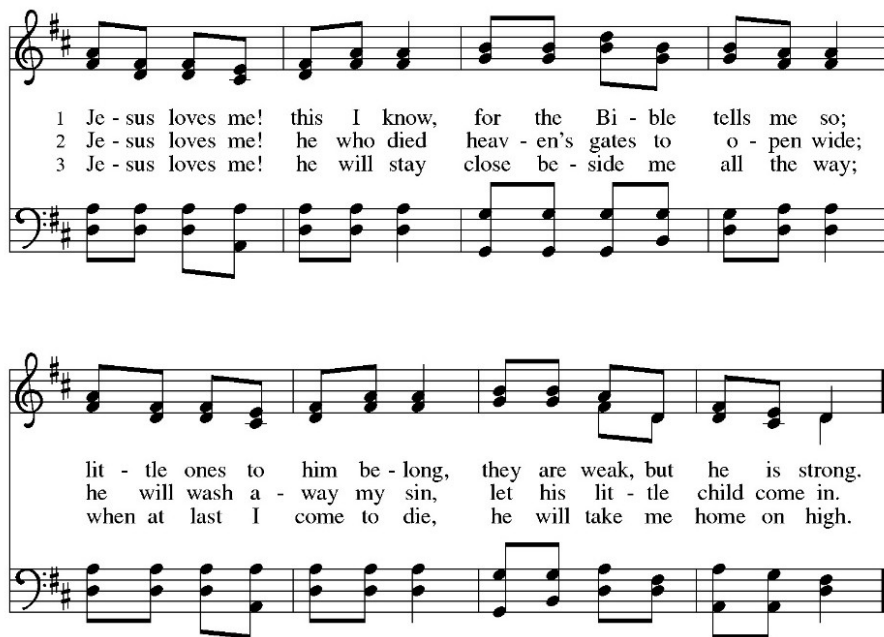

COMMEMORATIONS

Philipp Nicolai, died 1608; Johann Heermann, died 1647; Paul Gerhardt, died 1676; hymnwriters

Sunday, October 26, 2025

These great hymnwriters all worked in seventeenth-century Germany in times of war and plague. Nicolai, a pastor, lost 1,300 parishioners to plague, 170 in one week. He wrote "O Morning Star, how fair and bright" and "Wake, awake, for night is flying." Heermann's hymns, including "Ah, holy Jesus," often express the emotions of faith. Gerhardt, perhaps the greatest Lutheran hymnwriter, was a pastor in Berlin.

Simon and Jude, Apostles

Tuesday, October 28, 2025

We know little about these apostles. Simon is listed as "the zealot" or Cananean in New Testament lists. Jude, also called Thaddeus, asked Jesus at the last supper why he had revealed himself to the disciples but not to the world.
