

Whoever wishes to be first among you must be a servant of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve and to give his life a ransom for many. Mark 10:44-45

St. James Family:

The main point of our gospel on October 20th was quite simple. Jesus encourages us to serve others. As we have said many times before, the way <u>up</u> in God's economy is <u>down</u>. Those who want to be great must become a servant of all.

From Glory to Servant

James and John come to Jesus with a question. They asked to sit next to Jesus in positions of power when Jesus is in his glory.

 Jesus doesn't scorn their ambition. It is not wrong or misguided to desire greatness in the kingdom. • Jesus also doesn't refute the assertion made by the two disciples. There really is a place in glory where someone will sit on Jesus' left side and right side.

But Jesus knows they don't understand the implications of their question. A place of honor will definitely come to them, but it will come through suffering, humility, and **service.** He sets the example for them - first through his birth, then with his life, and finally with his sacrificial death.

The way up is down. Those who want to be great must become a servant of all.

The Problem with Service

The best way to learn how to be a servant is to see in action. Jesus was an example to James and John. In our own day these examples can be hard to find. Servants don't usually make headline news. Servants don't often get called up to the podium to be recognized. Servants seldomly receive memorials built in their honor.

We have to <u>seek out</u> examples so we can learn this lesson and then we have to <u>do it</u> so that those who come after us have their own example to follow. Perhaps you have an example of someone in your life who showed you what it is like to be a servant. Call that person to mind and thank God for them today. Just like James and John, all of us are in the process of becoming the kind of people who...

- find quiet ways to serve
- avoid the limelight
- become examples of service to the next generation

I encourage all of you to find your own example of <u>service</u> and determine to be that example for others. May we all grow in the grace of service as we follow our Savior's example.




