



As we celebrated the Feast of Christ the King, I invited you to imagine a reality in which the perfect, blameless, and altogether-good person of Jesus Christ is truly King. What would it be like?

- What if there was a King who ruled perfectly, justly, wisely and humbly?
- What if there was a King who cared for the poor?
- What if there was a King who kept corrupting power in check?
- What if there was a King who fulfilled every good and holy desire from his subjects?
- What if there was a King strong enough to defeat the forces that oppose him and gentle enough to welcome the beggar to his banquet?
- What if there was a King whose reign subverted national borders to unite every good intention in every human heart good under a single banner of truth and justice?

The statement "Christ is King" is an overtly political statement. There's no way around it. This statement has been a threat to every political authority in every era and region of the world where it has been uttered by those who declare its truth.

In the United States, we are especially distrustful of kings. It's in our blood. Our country was founded on the rejection of monarchy as an acceptable form of government. "No more King!" we said. "That's just too much power in the

hands of one person." But perhaps our distrust of political leaders, especially of monarchy, has seeped into a subtle distrust of Jesus as our King. Perhaps our inherited cultural overtones keep the reign of Christ at bay.

Our suspicion and distrust may give us pause, but the goodness of Christ compels us to look again. Jesus is a different kind of King over a different kind of a kingdom.

- This King does not derive his power from the typical power structures of our world.
- This King doesn't need to wage war to exercise his power because it was through him that all things in heaven and earth were made. Everything is his and always has been.
- This King doesn't need to argue with Pilot about theories of truth because in his very being truth has become one perfect and holy person.
- This King extends his reign into the world, not through violent conquest, but through the changed hearts of his subjects. These subjects demonstrate their love of the King by emulating his behavior.

Jesus has nothing to prove. He is confident and secure in an outcome that is already guaranteed. He stands there and by his very presence gives testimony to the reality of a reign that supersedes every other reign the world has ever known. It supersedes Pilot and every ruler to the present day.

This is the King every nation longs for. The prophet Hagai, speaking of the Messiah, says, "What is desired by all nations will come" says the LORD Almighty. (Haggai 2:7)

Do you remember this verse from the advent hymn, *O Come*, *O Come Emmanuel?*

O come, desire of nations, bind / In one the hearts of humankind Bid Thou our sad divisions cease / And be Thyself our King of peace

This is the King every nation longs for. The promised one. As journey through Advent we will meet the baby, meek and lowly, born in the manger who is <u>Christ the King</u>.

The Feast of Christ the King is a relatively recent addition to the liturgical calendar. It was instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI and adopted by Lutherans in the 1970s to reassert the primacy of the reign of Christ in the face of nationalism, secularism, and totalitarian governments in Russia, Italy, Spain, and Germany.

These destructive currents are thriving in our country and around the world today.

If you will permit me to say anything during this tumultuous political environment in the days in which we live, permit me to convince you of this:

There is a King who reigns on a throne eternally whose kingdom will never end (I am the alpha and the Omega, The beginning and the end). Whose reign extends into the world through his people.

He is a King of a different kind of a Kingdom. This Kingdom builds from the ground up and includes everyone who will follow the way of Jesus. All are invited. None will be denied. And every one of us can live today as full subjects in the Kingdom of God and whose King is Jesus Christ. This is the true Kingdom. This is the reality we must embrace if the land in which our houses, our homes, our church and our businesses will ever be made whole.

Christ is King and there is no other.

As you are all aware, we are having issues with drainage/water infiltration into the foundation and into the fellowship hall. To correct the problem we must remove the entire sidewalk on the east side of the building (just outside the Sacristy door to the stoop cap outside the narthex door). We will need to add compacted fill and drain tile and area drains to collect runoff from the building and surrounding grounds. We plan to replace the gutter and downspouts because they are leaking onto the sidewalk and direct those into the drain tile. Also, a portion of the sidewalk will be replaced, going out from the narthex. In addition, a portion of the east entrance stoop cap is badly cracked and contributes to water leaking into the storage closet below (where the tables and chairs are kept).

Our cost breakdown below includes replacement of the flooring to include the kitchen areas so that all tile will match, using a glue down waterproof plank. also included is the cost to replace the carpet in the office and repairs to the freezer (compressor replacement). Our plan would be to borrow the money and repay the loan with income raised from fundraisers and donations. We do not want to use cash reserves. As we all know with ourselves, there is maintenance with age!

Work has begun on the LED lighting, thanks to a generous contribution to cover the costs.

As you may remember, we have had huge expenses (electrical service, HVAC system) due to the maintenance and upkeep of our 70-year-old building.

Council met Sunday, November 23rd and approved the following work to be done:

Total estimated costs	\$30,000
Bell and tower tuckpointing	TBD
Remove and replace gutter and downspouts	\$2,000
Repair freezer compressor	\$2,500
Remove and replace flooring	\$8,950.00
Remove and replace exterior concrete	\$10,800.00

The December meeting of the St James GANG will be an outing. Meet at Devils' Glen HyVee for lunch.


Everyone buys their own lunch.


