



...he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. The eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to say to them,

"Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing."

Luke 4:20-21

Last Sunday, we pondered the account in St. Luke's gospel when Jesus stood in the synagogue in Nazareth and read these lines from the scroll of the Prophet Isaiah.

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim
release to the captives and
recovery of sight to the blind,
to set free those who are oppressed,
to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

We looked in some detail at the first line of this announcement, but time did not permit us to address the rest of the categories Jesus includes in his reading. Allow me to add a few words of commentary for our consideration today.

The good news announced by Jesus is not limited to the poor alone. It is for all people who, as Howard Thurman puts it in his book <u>Jesus and the Disinherited</u>, "have their backs up against the wall."

The work of God to which we are called is to bring heaven and earth together in such a way that *all* of these ailments and sufferings are eradicated from the earth, not by disposing, locking away, or erasing the people themselves, but by reviving and restoring all people *who have their backs up against the wall*. Restoration is the work of the Church.

As Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. once said, "[All people] are caught in an inescapable network of mutuality, tied in a single garment of destiny. Whatever affects one directly, affects all indirectly." In the church, there is a way of bearing one another's burdens - at times giving to those in need and at times receiving from others when we are in need - which lightens and even erases the burdens altogether. Because as Emma Lazarus put it, "Until we are all free, none of us are free."

There are currents at work in our world today that want to degrade, dispose, and even erase the very people to whom Jesus announced "good news" - people who are poor, people in prison, people with disabilities, people who are oppressed. Take time to read Jesus' words closely today.

Remember, in God's kingdom we are called to live as a community of people who are practicing the eradication of these ills because <u>we are our brother/sister/sibling's keeper.</u>

Please take note of some special opportunities to pray, learn, and dialogue together in the weeks to come. These are special events hosted by me so I want to bring them to your attention even though they are announced elsewhere in the *Epistle* and our announcements at our services.

Several people approached me in the last couple of months asking for a space to process their concerns and questions about current events and cultural trends in light of their Christian faith. St James GANG


The St James GANG will meet Feb. 20th in Fellowship Hall at 11:30—Bring your own lunch as usual. Dessert and beverages will be provided.
