#### Return to the Lord Your God

During this season of Lent, I pray we will give ourselves permission to take an honest look at our lives and deal truthfully with what we find. A sober look may do us good, and I pray we do not miss the opportunity. Several of our readings during this season emphasize the theme of *repentance*. To repent means 1) to turn away from the things in our lives that distract us and rob us of the true life we have in Jesus Christ and 2) to *return to the Lord your God, for God is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, abounding in steadfast love*.

Returning to God is sometimes a **big** task and sometimes a **small** task. So how do we do it?

#### **Big Ways**

We all have appetites in ourselves that rob us of the life God intends for us. If there is something in us that is destroying us, we must take drastic action to eliminate it from our lives.

During this season of Lent, first pray for God's help to show you what big things there might be in your life that you would ordinarily skip over. Many of us also have loved ones, friends, and neighbors who are suffering because some of these big appetites are wreaking havoc in their lives. Pray for them too. Pray that they would find freedom in Christ.

#### Small Ways

In the thousands of small ways we are distracted every day, we return to God by giving God our undivided attention. These are small moments of prayer that can happen hundreds of times each day. In these moments I encourage you to bow your head for just a few seconds and pray a simple prayer. Here are two prayers that might help you: God, I return to you. Renew my heart and my mind. Or, God, I give you my heart. Transform me in your grace. Small, moment-by-moment prayers like this grow into Redwoods over the course of a lifetime.

The St James G.A.N.G. will meet on April 24th in the Fellowship Hall at 11:30 a.m.


