As fall begins, I'd like to tell you about some of the wonderful plans percolating around our church. It has me all kinds of excited!

Communications Guild

On the evening of August 27th, a new team met to discuss how we might tell the story of the good things happening at St. James to our region. Until we find a better name, we are calling it the *Communications Guild*. Many good ideas were shared and we all left excited about the possibilities for our future together. I thought you might like to hear the broad strokes of where our conversation took us.

Through our brainstorming three main themes emerged.

First, we want to take the next steps on enhancing our witness online. This may take the form of short videos, targeted social media posts, and a host of other possibilities. For this idea to take root, we need someone to step forward and learn a new skill (or, maybe, dust off an old skill) and take the lead video editing. Maybe YOU are called to this activity. All it takes to get started is faithful attention, love for God, and

willingness to try something new. Please contact the Church Office if you are interested in discussing this more.

Second, we want to steer away from mass marketing mediums (like email blasts, canvasing, cold calling, and broadcast mailings) and instead focus on face-to-face encounters. We brainstormed several very practical opportunities for this at events in the greater Bettendorf area in 2026. Perhaps you would like to help with this idea or you have ideas about where we might set up a booth. Please contact the Church Office if you can help in this way.

Third, perhaps the greatest barrier to telling our story is to find people who want to hear it! We also want to partner with groups to host events at our church to encourage people to find our church building and make it through our front door. You heard about one such idea from Church Councilperson Tom Sladky during our announcement time last Sunday (8/24). Another idea was to engage local musicians to enhance the musical portions of our worship. Please contact the Church Office if you have ideas or want to get involved with hosting a group or event at our church.

These were just the beginnings of our conversation. I was encouraged by how practical all of the ideas were. These are things that our church - with our current resources of time and money - can begin over the next 6-12 months. Praise God!

Fall stewardship

On another note, we are going to begin our Fall Stewardship Season through the four weekends of October with a kick-off on Sunday, October 5th. Mark your calendars! More information will be coming your way through the month of September.



When Yehiel Curry was elected to serve as the fifth presiding bishop of the ELCA, *Living Lutheran* content editor John Potter sat down with him to talk about his passions, priorities and vision for the church.

"Before he became a pastor, then a bishop, then the chair of the Conference of Bishops, and now presiding bishop-elect, he was a social worker, then a teacher, then in sales. 'I went from being a social worker to a teacher in the same community where I was helping those families, and in both cases, what I learned is passion is very important. And if you can align a person's passion with a need, then it doesn't feel like work sometimes.

"'It wasn't until I was in the church that I said, 'I could do this for the rest of my life."




St James GANG
