# MESSAGE from the VICAR

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

In this season after Epiphany we find ourselves in a series of weeks exploring the first teachings of Jesus recorded in Matthew's gospel. Last week we heard "*Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is near.*"

To our ears, the word *repent* has taken on the meaning of feeling really, really sorry for something bad we have done. However, the original meaning of the word *repent* is not just a feeling of being sorry - it's an acceptance to see the world in a different way. It's a total transformation of the way we understand reality and, as a result, how we behave.

I said a lot regarding that theme in my sermon on Sunday, but I'd like to share with you one additional consideration for those of us who want to take the theme of *repentance* seriously, especially as we look ahead to the beginning of Lent this month.

I'll start with this question: If we are to change, what's the difference between where we are now and where we ought to be? This is a question I pray we all ask ourselves. It's worthy of our consideration.

In the United States there is a lot of talk about which Christian views/opinions are the correct ones. There are the so-called "Christian

nationalists" and so-called "progressive Christians" battling out ideas in the public square. The ideas from these two sides are usually opposites and tend to line up with the political parties they prefer. Finding wisdom and clarity from the heart of God can be difficult if we are trying to sound more like Jesus than our preferred news sources - and that includes the TV networks as well as talk radio, podcasts, and the like.

Here's the consideration I offer to you today. It is hardest to distinguish between two things that sound similar. We can get stuck in the language we use. When words like *freedom* and *justice* get thrown around, we have to step back and ask, "Are they using those words the same way Jesus uses those words?"

When Jesus said, "Follow me," he was saying, "Get to know me. Do what I do. Love what I love. Behave as I would behave." **Above all we need to get to know the heart of God by getting to know Jesus and prioritizing what Jesus prioritizes.** That means when Jesus teaches, we pay attention. Closely. And when the talking heads start using words that Jesus uses, we go back to what he taught and compare - critically, at times - what they mean to what Jesus means.

Yes, it is hardest to distinguish between two things that sound similar, but remember: we are not alone in this journey. God gives us his own Spirit to cheer us and to guide us. God gives us counselors, therapists, spiritual directors, pastors, and wise friends to bring insight to our condition. God uses the grace of repentance and the grace of these gifts to transform us in the midst of these confusing times. Praise God for his faithfulness and provision for the journey!

I am eager to celebrate Lent with you all!
